

## Office of the Registrar SESSION DESCRIPTIONS

## LSUA offers many sessions throughout the semester. Below is a breakdown of each session and definition of how each is used for course offerings

**Full Session** – Courses that are offered the entire semester term of 16 weeks (8 weeks for Summer semester)

**A-Session:** – Courses that are offered for the <u>first</u> half of the semester for an 8 *week* period

**B-Session:** – Courses that are offered for the <u>second</u> half of the semester for an 8 week period

2<sup>nd</sup> Session – Courses that are offered for a *seven week* period starting the <u>first half</u> of the semester for students who are taking an online course (*not to be used for students declared in a 100% online accelerated degree program*)

**3rd Session** – Courses that are offered for a *seven week* period starting at the *second half* of the semester for students who are taking an online course (*not to be used for students declared in a 100% online accelerated degree program*)

## Section numbers are created to identify each session offered at LSUA

The following are codes used at the **beginning of a section number** to *signify length of the session*:

 $\mathbf{0}$  = standard timed course - runs the full 16 weeks

A = A session, 8 weeks - course starts with full session course and ends at mid-term of semester

 $\mathbf{B} = \mathbf{B}$  session, 8 weeks - course starts at mid-term of the semester and ends when full session courses end

2=2nd Session – 7 week - courses that occur within the <u>first half</u> of the semester

3 = 3rd Session - 7 week - courses that occur with the <u>second half</u> of the semester

The following are codes used at the **end of section number** <u>to signify the</u> <u>delivery method of the course</u>

 $\mathbf{X} = \mathbf{standard \ course}$ , meets in person for number of credit hours offered each week

I = Internet Course is 100% online, there are no requirements to come to campus

J = 75-99% of course is delivered online, there are some requirements to meet on campus

K = 50-74% of course is delivered online, regular course meetings are scheduled for 25-50% of class time.

L = 25% or less of the course is delivered online, regular course meetings are scheduled for 75% or more of class time.

EX: Course offered in A-session and offered 75-99% on line: A71J

**EX:** Course offered in regular full session , 100% online: **0011** 

## **100% ONLINE ACCELERATED PROGRAMS**

100% Online Accelerated Degree Programs – Courses that are offered in the online TERMS are only for those <u>students whose declared academic program is 100%</u> <u>online</u> – These courses are offered in two sessions of *seven week* each. The term is reflected as follows:

TERM 2, ex: SPRING 2, FALL 2, and SUMMER 2 used for the *first seven* weeks

TERM 3, ex: SPRING 3, FALL 3 and SUMMER 3 used for the *second seven* weeks

**<u>NOTE</u>**: A <u>100% online student</u> should only be registered in courses offered within these TERMS ending in a number 2 or 3

TERM 2 (SPRING 2, FALL 2, SUMMER 2) or

TERM 3 (SPRING 3, FALL 3, SUMMER 3)

Example of degree codes for 100% online programs:

BSOADM – Business Administration BSOCJ – Criminal Justice BSONUR – Nursing (BSN)

<u>Course section numbers</u> for Term 2 (FALL 2, SPRING 2, SUMMER 2) or Term 3 (FALL 3, SPRING 3, SUMMER 3) which are the ONLY terms used for the 100% online programs, are signified as:

Term 2 (*FALL 2, SPRING 2, SUMMER 2*) - 271I (not to be used by students declared in <u>"traditional, on-campus"</u> programs that want to take online classes)

**Term 3** (*FALL 3, SPRING 3, SUMMER 3*) - **371I** (not to be used by students declared in <u>"traditional, on-campus"</u> programs that want to take online classes)
