Healthy Relationships Week

A 2019 Association of American Universities climate survey found that roughly 10% of college students experience intimate partner violence, which includes dating and domestic violence. Of those reporting, some 42% didn't tell anyone due to stigma or fear of repercussions. In another disturbing trend, 57% of students stated it was very difficult to identify dating violence. During the last week of October, we're partnering with the Family Justice Center of CenLA to encourage open discussion of intimate partner violence, help students to recognize healthy relationships, and introduce students to local resources to escape or report violent relationships. 








Cybersecurity Awareness Do Your Part. #BeCyberSmart

October is Cybersecurity Awareness Month. It was launched in October 2001 by the National Cyber Security Alliance and the U.S. Department of Homeland Security in an effort to help all Americans stay safer and secure online. Read the White House's Proclamation on Cybersecurity Awareness Month.

For this month, IET services relased a mock phishing email to check how aware we are of recognzing phishing emails. Unfortunately, a lot of LSUA users clicked on the links in the mock email and provided their credentials. Even though this particular email was a mock phishing attempt, this will not always be the case. Our campus receives phishing attempts multiple times a day, so clicking on fradulent links and providing your credentials is a huge security risk to our organization.

Remember these 7 important tips:

1. Always watch out for phishing attempts. Never let your guard down.

2. Always check for valid email addresses. Hover your mouse over the email address or the sender's name to see where it is really coming from. If the "from user" and the email address do not match, it is a phishing attempt.

3. Look for the "External" flags on eamils. This will let you know that the email is coming from outside of LSUA.

4. Phishing attempts like to ask for "strange" and/or urgent requests.

5. Look for incorrect capitalization, bad spelling, and bad grammar. These are common in phishing attempts.

6. Hover your mouse over links to make sure it's going to the intended destination. If is it not, do not click on it.

7. Never open or download an attachement from an unknown or "strange" source. Attachements may contain viruses that can compromise your computer and personal information.

Cybersecurity Awareness Training

As of October 2021, less than half of LSUA users have completed the Cybersecurity Awareness Training. This training is required and should be completed by December 31, 2021.

The training will teach LSUA users how to identify key indicators of cyber threats, how to use counter measures to safeguard against cyber threats, and how to apply strategies to limit the damage in the event of a cyber-attack.
